This past week, the University hosted a series of events to recognize our rich tradition of military excellence dating back to our founding as a military school and to honor the 10,000-plus Clemson men and women who have served in the armed forces. This series of events concludes today with our <u>Military Appreciation Day</u> football game against Wake Forest. Events begin at 9:00 a.m., and veterans will be recognized throughout the day.

Yesterday was a special time for our campus as we celebrated Legacy Day. This beloved <u>fall tradition</u> is a time for Clemson students to learn about our rich history and the importance of paying thanks to those who have given back to the University. Roy '41 and Marnie Pearce were recognized with a bronze leaf dedication and induction into the Fort Hill Legacy Society, which honors donors posthumously for leaving \$1 million or more to the University in their estate. Last night at the Madren Center, we extended our gratitude and thanks to our generous donors at the annual Gratitude Gala. Donors were honored during the Cumulative Giving and Legacy Society Induction Ceremony, which was followed by a reception with hors d'oeuvres and entertainment.

Clemson professor, Patrick McMillan, is the co-creator and host of the popular Emmy-award winning ETV nature program "Expeditions with Patrick McMillan." Clemson is excited to say that the naturalist and educator has received the <u>Glenn '65 and</u> <u>Heather Hilliard Endowed Professorship in Environmental Sustainability</u>. The Hilliards have given \$1 million to establish an endowment for a professor to teach and motivate future generations to both treasure and manage the balance between the natural and human-made worlds. <u>This gift</u> qualified Clemson for a dollar-to-dollar match from the state under the SmartState program, creating a \$2 million professorship.

We are excited to say that the <u>Adobe Digital Studio</u> has opened in the Cooper Library! "The opening of the Adobe Digital Studio, truly a 'maker space' for digital creativity, is a landmark event for Clemson," said Jim Bottum, vice provost and chief information officer at Clemson.
